Moon Over Buffalo is a 1995 comic play by Ken Ludwig set in Buffalo, New York in 1953. In the madcap comedy tradition of Lend Me a Tenor, the hilarious Moon Over Buffalo centers on George and Charlotte Hay, fading stars of the 1950s. At the moment, they're playing Private Lives and Cyrano De Bergerac in "rep" in Buffalo, New York with five actors. On the brink of a disastrous split-up caused by George's dalliance with a young ingénue, they receive word that they might just have one last shot at stardom: Frank Capra is coming to town to see their matinee, and if he likes what he sees, he might cast them in his movie remake of The Scarlet Pimpernel. Unfortunately for George and Charlotte, everything that could go wrong does go wrong, abetted by a visit from their daughter's clueless fiancé and hilarious uncertainty about which play they're actually performing, caused by Charlotte's deaf, old stage-manager mother who hates every bone in George's body.

- Charlotte Hay, George's wife and actress in his company.
- Rosalind (Roz), George & Charlotte's daughter, who left the stage to lead a "normal" life.
- Howard, a TV weatherman and Rosalind's fiancé.
- Paul, stage manager for George's company, and Rosalind's ex-fiancé.
- **Ethel**, Charlotte's nearly-deaf mother.
- **Richard**, a love sick lawyer who is courting Charlotte.
- Eileen, an actress in George's company who was George's "one-night stand."
